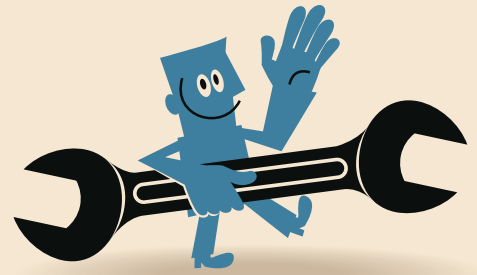
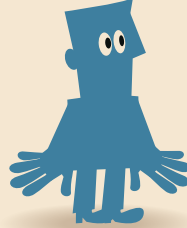
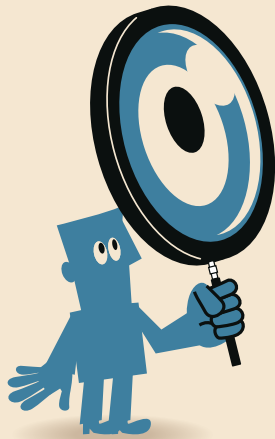

'Seeing, Thinking, Doing' provides a personal framework to stay calm and 'stay the course'. Working with children who can be extremely reactive to the world around them and in particular to those adults who are committed to them, can be very confronting for carers, case workers and teachers. Maintaining your role as the 'captain of the ship' or the 'driver of the school bus' can take an enormous amount of energy when children and young people are threatening, spitting, swearing, and running away.

The objectives of this seminar are:

- To understand how energy can be transferred from one person to another, triggering unwanted reactions
- To develop an awareness of your own triggers and internal reactions to children and young people's challenging behaviours
- To explore the reasons we sometimes See, Do, Think rather than See, Think, Do
- To develop a personal safety plan for when you feel threatened
- To adopt the 'Seeing, Thinking, Doing' framework when responding to children and young people

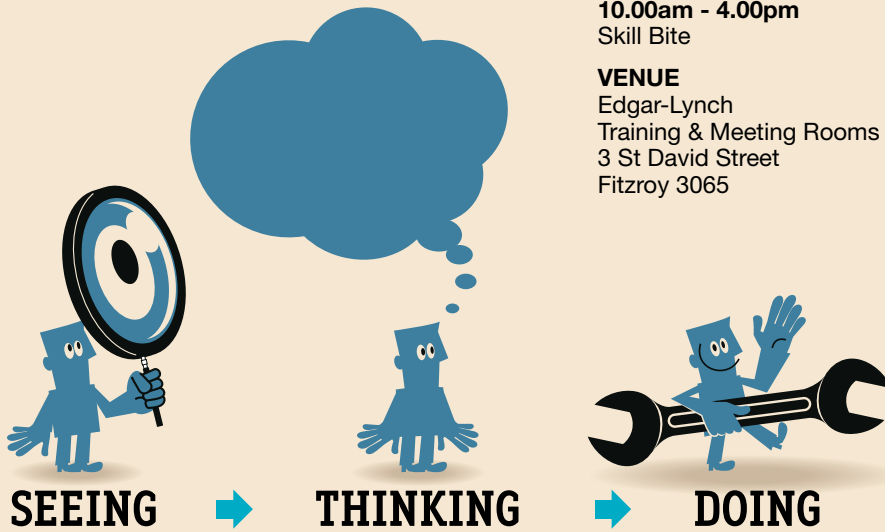
