- To explore the reasons we sometimes See, Do, Think rather than See, Think, Do
- To develop a personal safety plan for when you feel threatened
- To adopt the 'Seeing, Thinking, Doing' framework when responding to children and young people

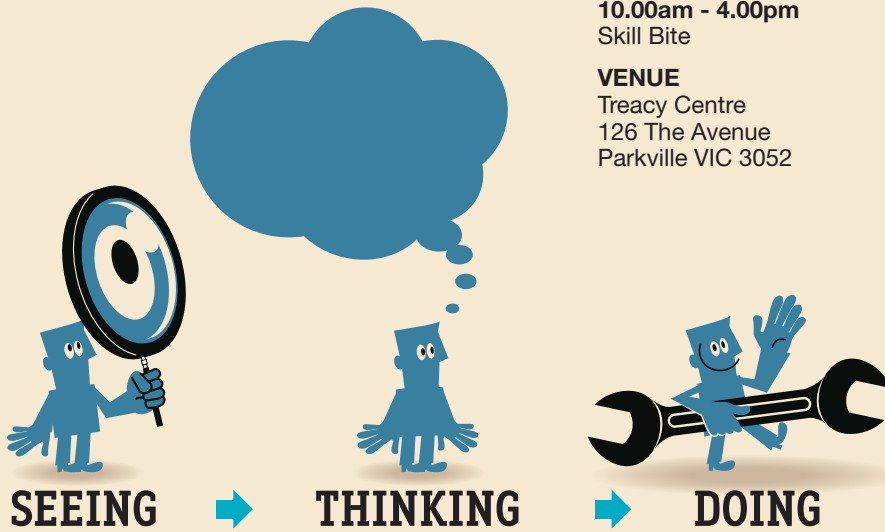
