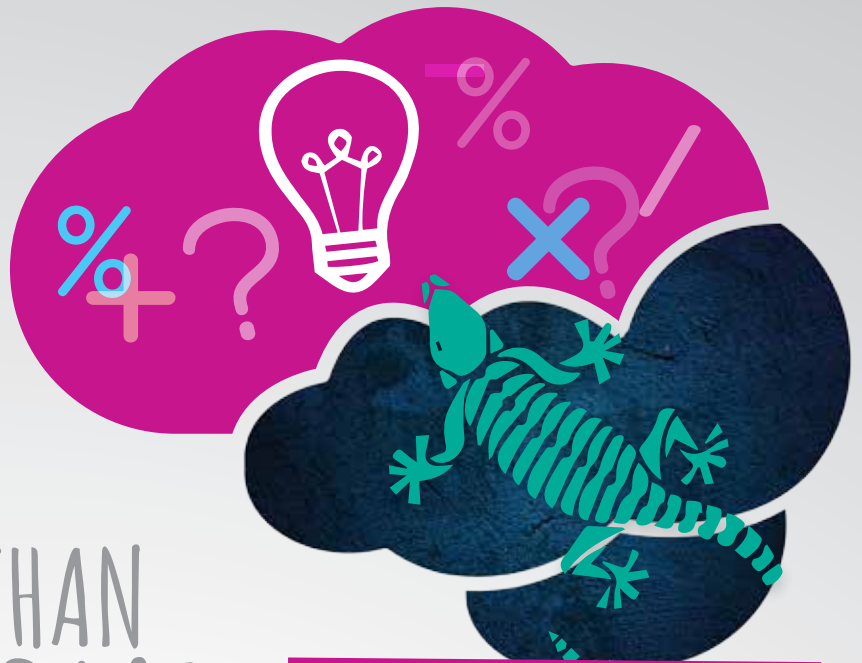


# WHY TWO BRAINS AREN'T ALWAYS BETTER THAN ONE

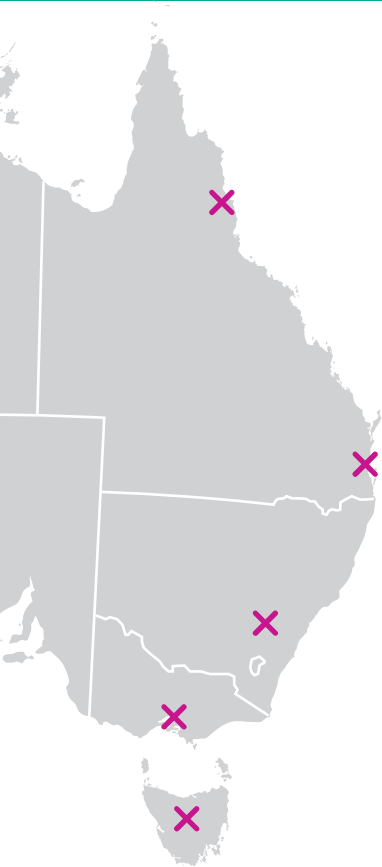

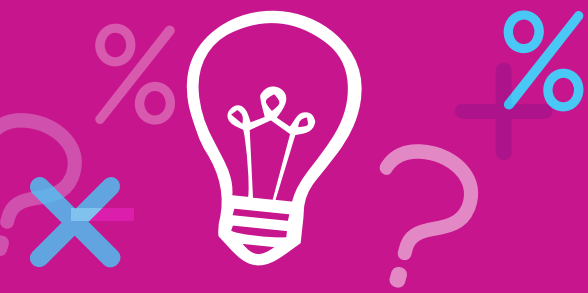
